

Rule 375-3-1-.07. Knowledge Tests

(a) Applicants for all classes of licenses and non-commercial instruction permits must receive a grade of at least 75 points out of a possible 100 on the appropriate test examining their understanding of official traffic control devices, knowledge of safe driving practices and the traffic laws of Georgia. The applicant will be considered to have failed the examination for cheating on any portion of the tests.

(b) If an applicant's failure is due to cheating, the applicant will not be eligible to retake the knowledge test until thirty (30) days after the date of the failure.

~~(bc)~~ For motorcycle permits (MP), the knowledge test score shall be valid for one (1) calendar year.

~~(ed)~~ The MP is valid for six (6) months from the date of issuance and is limited to one renewal.

SYNOPSIS

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF PROPOSED RULE

The purpose of this amendment is to correct a clerical error and to establish a wait period for applicants who cheat on the exam.

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN EXISTING AND PROPOSED RULES

In paragraph (a), the "s" is deleted at the end of "tests" in the last sentence of the paragraph because we are talking about one test. A new paragraph (b) was added to set the time of eligibility to retest after cheating to 30 days. Old paragraphs (b) and (c) were renumbered to (c) and (d).
