

Virtual Road Test: Quick Facts

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

The Virtual Road Test (VRT) is an innovative way to test non-commercial drivers utilizing a dual-view camera with live communication. VRT is now the standard method of testing drivers. A licensed adult must ride with the testing customer, and (s)he must have a mobile phone available for two-way communication.

THE NUMBERS

From Jan 1, 2022 to June 1, 2025, 166,658 customers have taken the Virtual Road Test with a 92% pass rate. Initial data shows these test takers have fewer overall convictions (24 vs. 27 per 100 individuals) and were less likely to receive a conviction (17.2% vs. 18.6%) after passing the VRT compared to traditional testers. They also had fewer lane violation convictions (6.7% vs. 7.6%) compared to traditional testers. Overall, drivers aged 21-24, as well as Atlanta metro residents, had fewer convictions after taking the Virtual Road Test.


Conviction Rates: Virtual vs Traditional Road Testers



CUSTOMER EXPERIENCE

When asked, customers advised they feel more comfortable and less anxious driving with someone they know, leading to better performance. The process is simple, fast, stress-free, and helps them feel safer by avoiding potential illnesses.

Examiners reported they feel safer observing the skills test from a computer rather than in the car with a new driver. Likewise, they feel VRT reduces their risk of illnesses and physical injury.

The customer only needs to bring a licensed driver who is at least 21 years of age, a cell phone, and their confidence!
